## SCHOOL AND DISTRICT

Huntington Beach High School (HBHS) is a Western Association of Schools and Colleges accredited high school in Huntington Beach, CA. HBHS is one of six comprehensive high schools in the Huntington Beach Union High School District (HBUHSD). The mission of HBHS is: We will educate, prepare, and inspire our students to change the world. We have a clear vision of excellence in academics, co-curricular student life, as well as in developing students into healthy, responsible citizens that will Learn, Thrive, and Give.

## CURRICULUM

Huntington Beach High School offers a strong college preparatory program and a variety of electives (refer to [HBHS Course Catalog](#)). The school year consists of two 18-week semesters. A typical schedule is a minimum of six classes for Freshmen and Sophomores and five classes for Juniors and Seniors. Classes are offered on a traditional schedule on Mondays and block schedule on Tuesday-Friday.

**Graduation Requirement:** A total of 220 credits must be completed. Students receive five credits at the end of each semester for each course in which a grade of "D" or better is earned.

**Required Classes:** English 40 credits • World History 10 credits • U.S. History 10 credits • U.S Govt. 5 credits • Economics 5 credits • Math 30 credits • Life Science 10 credits • Physical Science 10 credits • Health 5 credits • Physical Education 20 credits • Visual Performing Arts or World Language or CTE 10 credits • Electives 65 credits

## GRADING AND CLASS RANK

All courses are included in the GPA and class rank. The GPA is the average of the points assigned to a letter grade (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0). +/- do not affect the GPA. A grade of "CR" indicates credits were earned. "W" notation indicates withdrawal and "WF" notation indicates withdrawal failure. Weighted classes are designated by the term Honors or Advanced Placement in the title. Class rank is determined using the student's cumulative weighted GPA.

NOTE: If a student remediated a "D" or "F" grade with a grade of "C" or better, the higher grade is issued to determine GPA.

### SPECIAL PROGRAMS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ **Academy of the Performing Arts (APA):** APA is a magnet program in HBUHSD located on the Huntington Beach High School campus. APA enrolls students of all grade levels through an application and/or audition process. Nine disciplines are offered. This year, 411 students are participating in APA.
- ★ **Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID):** AVID is a college and career readiness program and participants enroll in a grade-level AVID elective class. There are 7 sections of AVID and 215 students are participating.
- ★ **Athletics:** HBHS offers 29 athletic teams with at least 39% of students participating in at least one sport.
- ★ **Career Technical Education (CTE):** Students can develop technical skills by progressing in any of the following CTE pathways: 1) Costume Design, 2) Film & TV Production, 3) Culinary, 4) Dance, 5) Engineering, 6) Entrepreneurship, 7) Marketing, 8) Entertainment Production & Design, 9) Professional Music, 10) Software & Systems Development, 11) Patient Care, 12) Sports Medicine, 13) Sustainable Agriculture
- ★ **Dual Enrollment with Golden West College:** Students can enroll in free college courses and receive both high school and college credit upon completion. On average, there are 24-27 classes offered each fall, spring, and summer terms.
- ★ **Model United Nations (MUN):** HBHS MUN is a four-year program that is nationally recognized for its excellence. This year, 298 students are participating in MUN, and they are required to enroll in an honors or AP history/MUN class.
