SCHOOL AND DISTRICT

Huntington Beach High School (HBHS) is a Western Association of Schools and Colleges accredited high school in Huntington Beach, CA. HBHS is one of six comprehensive high schools in the Huntington Beach Union High School District (HBUHSD). The mission of HBHS is: We will educate, prepare, and inspire our students to change the world. We have a clear vision of excellence in academics, co-curricular student life, as well as in developing students into healthy, responsible citizens that will Learn, Thrive, and Give.

CURRICULUM

Huntington Beach High School offers a strong college preparatory program and a variety of electives (refer to <u>HBHS Course Catalog</u>). The school year consists of two 18-week semesters. A typical course schedule is six courses for Freshmen and Sophomores and five courses for Juniors and Seniors. Classes are offered on a traditional schedule on Mondays and block schedule from Tuesday-Friday.

Graduation Requirement: A total of 220 credits must be completed. Students receive five credits at the end of each semester for each course in which a grade of "D" or better is earned.

GRADING AND CLASS RANK

All courses given are included in the GPA and class rank. The GPA is the average of the points assigned to a letter grade (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0). +/- grades do not affect the GPA. A grade of "CR" indicates credits were earned. "W" notation indicates withdrawal and "WF" notation indicates withdrawal failure. Weighted classes are designated by the term Honors or Advanced Placement in the title. Class rank is determined using the cumulative weighted GPA.

NOTE: If a student remediated a "D" or "F" grade with a grade of "C" or better, the higher grade is issued to determine GPA.

In May 2023, 631 students took AP exams. A total of 1,290 AP exams were taken in 29 subject areas. 78% of the AP exams received scores of 3 or higher.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ Academy of the Performing Arts (APA): APA is a magnet program in HBUHSD located on the Huntington Beach High School campus. APA enrolls students of all grade levels through an application and/or audition process. Nine disciplines are offered. Approximately 700 students participate in APA each year.
- ★ Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID): AVID is a college and career readiness program and participants enroll in a grade-level AVID elective class. There are 6 sections of AVID and approximately 160 students participate each year.
- ★ Athletics: HBHS offers 32 athletic teams with at least 41% of students participating in at least one sport.
- ★ Career Technical Education (CTE): Students can develop technical skills by progressing in a CTE pathway. Current pathways are: 1) Culinary, 2) Dance, 3) Design, Visual & Media Arts, 4) Engineering, 5) Media Tech, 6) Ornamental Horticulture, 7) Production & Managerial Arts, 8) Professional Music, 9) Software & Systems Development, 10) Entrepreneurship.
- ★ Dual Enrollment with Golden West College: Students can enroll in free college courses and receive both high school and college credit upon completion. Currently, there are 20 classes offered each fall, spring and summer terms.
- ★ Model United Nations (MUN): HBHS MUN is a four-year honors program that is nationally recognized for its excellence.

 Approximately 350 students participate each year and participants are required to enroll in an honors history/MUN class.
